

Big month for the La Crosse chapter: hosting of the German delegates, planning Toys for Tots and Rockin' for Tots, worked End of Summer Bash and the Oktoberfest Apparel Booth, and brought home the Gold from State Convention in Wausau. The last quarter of the year with State Volleyball; elections of the 2014 President, VPs and Directors; Toys for Tots and Rockin' for Tots; Rotary Lights; Jaycee Week; and Packer Socials.

On Monday September 16th, the German Twinning Delegation arrived in La Crosse for one day on their tour around the State of Wisconsin. As part of the Twinning program, JCI Wisconsin shares time with the State of Hessen in Germany each year. In the Spring, a Delegation from Wisconsin travels to Germany to meet with the Jaycee counterparts in the State of Hessen. This Fall, a group of five Delegates traveled to Wisconsin to join us for a day on Monday, September 16th. We toured Grandads Bluff and then stopped at the International Friendship Gardens to meet with La Crosse Mayor Tim Kabat. We also took a very informative tour of Inland Printing on French Island. Inland Printing makes labels for many various vendors including Coors light, Disney and various beverage companies. In the evening, we met at Piggy's Blues Lounge and had a great Social dinner with the German Delegation. After the dinner, each of the Delegates left with their respective hosts for the evening. On Tuesday morning, we drove to Tomah and toured Habelmans Cranberry Marsh. We learned many interesting facts about cranberries including that Wisconsin is the leading cranberry state. Also, Hablemans produce about 33% of the Worlds fresh fruit cranberries! It was interesting to learn that cranberries have only been in the German market for only 15 years. At the conclusion of the tour, the Delegation was delivered to the Prairie Du Chien Jaycees to continue their Wisconsin tour. So, does this give you an inkling to visit our friends and fellow Jaycees in Germany? Applications for the twinning are due by December 31st so you have some time to apply but don't wait, spots
